<p>Senior Thesis Encouraged for those planning on going to graduate or professional school (law school, medical school, etc.)</p>	<p>Senior Project This option provides students the opportunity to design their own historically-based project in close consultation with a faculty member. <p>Requirements Produce a 25-30 page paper based on original research in primary and secondary sources. Meet weekly with thesis director. Turn in all assignments on time. Must have thesis director and second reader in the department.</p>	<p>All Senior Projects, regardless of their nature require the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A thesis statement 2. A substantial bibliography 3. An historiographical essay/literature review (5-7 pages) 4. A reflection/process paper 5. Evidence of critical analysis of primary sources <p>Turn in all assignments on time.
